- Seafood consumption is rising worldwide and the degradation of fish stocks continues (overexploited resources, environmental damage, climate change, etc.). In this context, consumers, retailers, restaurants and processors are now seeking “sustainable seafood and traceability”.

SOLUTION

What is the MSC?

The MSC is an independent non-profit organization founded in 1997 with the aim of transforming the seafood market to make it more sustainable by:

- reversing the decline in global fish stocks
- delivering improvements in the marine environment
- contributing to securing fishers' livelihood.

The MSC has developed 2 standards: one for fishery assessments and the second for Chain of Custody (traceability) in the supply chain. This “Business to Consumer” standard allows placement of an MSC logo on products, visible to consumers. For the fishery assessment, Bureau Veritas complies with the 3 principles of the MSC standard:

- respect to the targeted stock
- respect to the associated ecosystem
- an efficient fishery management system

For the Chain of Custody assessment, Bureau Veritas certifies that processors, exporters, importers and distributors have sourced their seafood products from MSC certified fisheries and rigorously manage the traceability.

What are the key benefits?

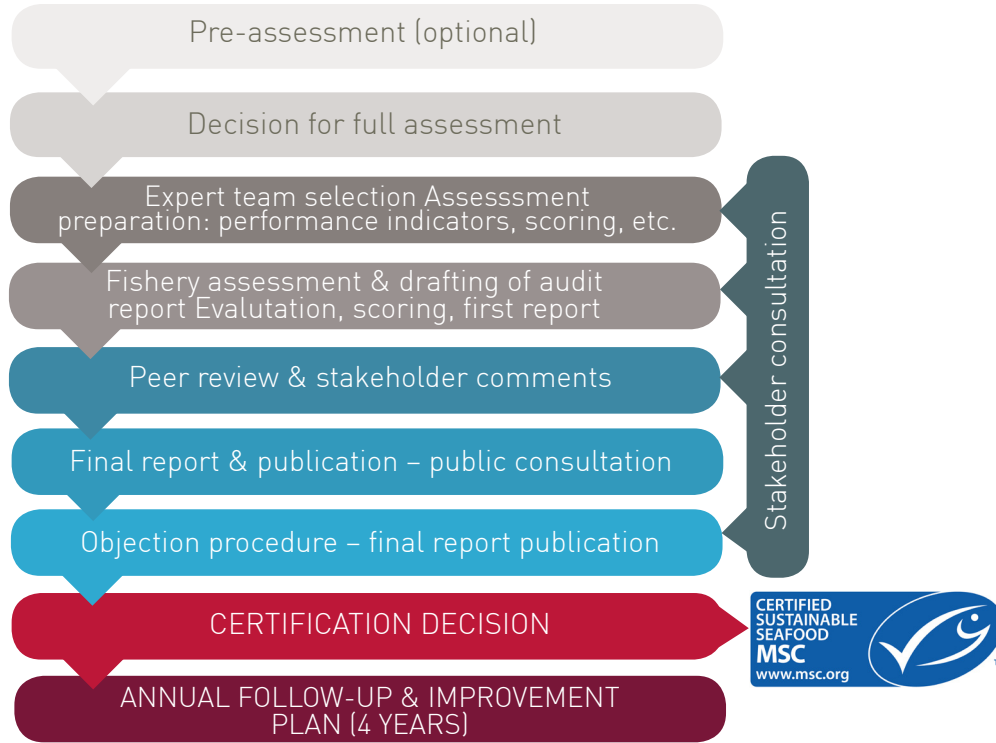
- The MSC is an objective solution which allows you to define your fishing product policy.
- The MSC logo is recognized by consumers in the EU, Japan and US markets and is a key strategy to differentiate your products from competitors.
- Increases consumer and stakeholder confidence.





OUR APPROACH

- For MSC Fishery certification, the following process is used:



For MSC Chain of Custody certification, the process includes one initial audit focused on traceability management. After the initial audit, if there is a favorable conclusion, a certificate is issued with a validity of three years. The annual follow-up audit is performed on-site for the two following years.

FAQ

If I am a processor, how may I obtain a fishing eco-label on my products?

In order to become MSC certified, your industry must comply with the MSC Chain of Custody standard by an accredited certification body such as Bureau Veritas in order to show your seafood products can be traced from MSC certified fisheries.
